THIS WEEK'S CHALLENGE FROM PASTOR ERIC

We're finishing up our mini sermon series on "Stay Off the Fence." Today, we're discussing compromise. Think about this, parents. America is in danger of losing an entire generation of young people. Why? I believe it's because of a lack of male leadership in the home. There is a war against the family with high stakes, and the key to winning this war is leadership. We need men to enlist in the war on the family. Now, if you're a dad, I know you're probably willing to lay down your life for your children. My question to you is this. Are you willing to live for your family? Are you willing to sacrifice your life now for your children? Are you willing to reprioritize your family and stop compromising? What our children need today are men of spiritual quality who are devoted to their families. Let me give you a few ways to do this.

1. Give your child enough freedom to enjoy life without being overprotective.
 2. Don't show favoritism or compare your children to each other.
 3. Offer encouragement, not discouragement.
 4. Don't force your child to be something he or she is not.
 5. Spend time with your children; show them that you love them.
 6. Never ever be cruel.
 7. Raise your children with strong, spiritual direction. (This means we are to provide protection, correction, and instruction.)
- Children need dads who are kind, who show appreciation and affirmation, who are sensitive to feelings, and who are not afraid to say, "I'm sorry." They need dads who will teach them the rules and regulations and provide a moral compass. Dads, let's step it up a notch and stop compromising and put our families first. If there's anything I can pray with you about, please let me know. I love you. Preacher

EVANGELISM THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR MATT

I thought for this week I could share some practical ways to share your faith. We are closing in on the last of the year. Don't wait to make a New Year's resolution! Apply now!

1. As you deepen friendships with co-workers, ask sincere questions and truly listen in a spirit of caring as they share about their lives. When appropriate, tell others you're praying for them. (Then make sure you actually do pray!)
2. Make it a daily habit to pray as you drive to work or as you walk into the office. Ask God to help you see your workplace as a mission field.
3. Refuse to hide or play-down the importance of your faith. When it naturally fits a conversation, freely talk about the role your church, prayer, Scripture, and Christian community have in your life. Let others see the joy and purpose you find in your faith.
4. Emphasize the importance of God's love for all people by initiating opportunities to lead your co-workers in service or charity. For example, lead a canned food drive for a local food pantry or organize your company's annual blood drive. When appropriate, share in conversation how you are motivated to help others by God's character and His love.
